

Our next talk – the Irish in Huddersfield

At our next meeting, on **Monday 28 November**, John Lambe will speak about **The Irish in Huddersfield**. Based on a forthcoming 'Discover Huddersfield' Trail leaflet, his talk will cover the key places in Huddersfield associated with the Irish, using each place to explain the history of the local Irish community from the first arrivals in the early 1800s through to more modern-day migration. Examining how each generation

has left its mark on the Town, it will conclude with an overview of key people who are still very much influential in Huddersfield today.

The speaker, John Lambe, is a Huddersfield lad born and bred, of Irish



descent through his mother. He has been involved in many aspects of Irish culture and organisations over the years, and is currently Secretary of the Huddersfield St. Patrick's Day Parade Association. His interest in local history, based on his own heritage, has been reinforced through his current role in Kirklees Council, as Historic England Huddersfield High Street Heritage Action Zone project officer,

The meeting is at **7.30 pm** in the Bronte Lecture Theatre, University of Huddersfield (see campus map).

Our Square photo competition winners

Results of the photography competition we have run as part of the Society's Our Square project were announced at our recent History Day.



The winner was Roger Kinder for 'Timeless' (above). The judges commented:

'We felt that the style and composition well reflect the timeless quality of the Square as does the monochrome treatment. The multiple exposure technique provided a reminder of the countless many who've flowed through the station entrance over the decades. This was a worthy winner which told a story in a creative way.'

Runner-ups were 'Walking with a Purpose' and 'The Head of Steam', both by Francis Wilson, while the judges gave special commendations to 'A Time for Reflection' (again by Francis Wilson) and 'When It All Gets Too Much' by Dan Reilly. All these, with the judges' comments, are well worth a look and can be found on the Our Square website.

The judges were Alan Stopher of Huddersfield Photo-Imaging Club; local artist Helen Robinson; Andrew Caveney, photographer (*Villas of Edgerton; Highfields, A Most Handsome Suburb*); and our own Christine Verguson and Dave Pattern. There were no under-18 entries, so they decided to award two runner-up prizes in the adult category. The winning entries will be shared with the West Yorkshire Archive Service (WYAS) to be preserved for future generations.

This competition was part of the Historic England funded High Street Heritage Action Zone (HSHAZ) scheme.


Edward Law History Prize 2023

Christmas is coming - more local books!





And while you're planning your presents, don't of course forget our own new titles:


- *Nature's Missionary*, Alan Brooke's biography of pioneer naturalist Seth Lister Mosley.

Both are available in local bookshops and through the website.


Wakefield Court Rolls - a bargain offer

The Society continues to be given second-hand books, often in the sad circumstance of a member's death. In recent months we have raised a remarkable £1700-plus from these, sharing the proceeds with the West Riding Kidney Patients Association in recognition that the largest part of the trove came from the late Brian Haigh's collection.

We now have to hand a series of volumes from the Wakefield Court Rolls series published over the years by the Yorkshire Archaeological Society, specifically those for the following years: 1331-3, 1338-40, 1350-2, 1433-36,1436-37, 1537-40 and 1550-2.
